July has come and gone, and once more we had an event packed month. International Convention in Orlando started off the month. The Varsity Youth Barbershop Contest saw Pioneer's very own Frontier Quartet bring home the Gold! Congratulations to those four young men who have been making Pioneer proud for so many years already. Your hard work and efforts have paid off for you with the ultimate prize, and Pioneer is very proud of you!

The Quartet contest brought even more excitement to Pioneer. Frontier place in the top 20, finishing in 18<sup>th</sup> place (82.1%). They brought the house down with their rendition of Do You Know The Muffin Man! Also making Pioneer proud were Upper Deck, finishing in 36<sup>th</sup> Place (78.9%) and The Hemidemisemiquaver 4 finishing in 38<sup>th</sup> place (78.5%).

In the Chorus Contest, the Great Lakes Chorus, with 51 men on stage scored an impressive 82.4% (with an 86% Performance Category score for one of their songs!). The Chorus placed 17<sup>th</sup> in the contest, but again were the talk of the convention floor for their moving performance of Tell My Father. Job well done to the Grand Rapids Chapter!

One other bit of congratulations is in order. Pioneer's own Ron Eubank was a part of the judging panel for International this year. Congratulations to Ron for being selected to be one of the C.A.'s for the International Contests this year. A great honor for Ron, and for Pioneer.

The Leadership Summit took place in Nashville the weekend before Harmony University. At those meetings current and future leaders from across the Society came to discuss many important aspects of the role of leaders in our organization.

Harmony University was once again held at Belmont University in Nashville at the end of the month. This week of intensive fun, learning (and ice cream!) is always a worthwhile endeavor. Each Chapter should consider how they want to support themselves, and the District, by sending music leaders, and future leaders to this great week of Barbershop emersion. Everyone that attends comes back refreshed and energized, filled with new and exciting ideas to bring back to their respective chapters.
