#### Explanation of the Contest

For the past twelve years, the Society for the Preservation and Encouragement of Barber Shop Quartet Singing in America has held a National (now International) Quartet contest. The first two or three contests were open to any Society Quartet which cared to enter. However, as the organization grew, the contest entries gave promise of being too numerous, so regional preliminary contests were set up. This year, Quartets from all over the United States and Canada are competing in fourteen regional contests for the right to compete in the International contest in Omaha June 7 to 11. The number of quartets selected from each region is determined from the porportion of SPEBSQSA members in that region. The Michigan region, which contains approximately 10% of the Barber Shoppers, is allotted four quartets out of forty. Thus, the twelve quartets which you will hear tonight are competing for four places. In addition, a fifth quartet, will be named as alternate.
