



The Kalamazoo Chapter has done it again! For the fourth year in a row the Kalamazoo Chapter has led the District in donations per member for Logopedics. Late in December "72", I received a call from the Kalamazoo Chapter saying they were making a donation to Logopedics and would I come over and accept the check. You bet I would! As you can see by the picture, the check for this donation was for one thousand dollars!!!

Just in the last four years the Kalamazoo Chapter has donated \$4,925.00. Man--that's a bundle of money...Averaged out per man, that comes to over \$107.00 per man for the four year period. That's a record we could all be proud of.

1972 was a good year for the Pioneer District. We moved into 6th place in average donation per man throughout the Society. At this point there are only 5 Districts ahead of us. I feel that this is real progress as we moved up a couple of notches this year. Although we are in 6th spot, there is a \$9.00 average difference per man between our position and top dog, so you see we still have a ways to go.
