When the conference committee first started the planning for the 2022 Spring Convention in January, I had thought with all of the concerns around gathering together that we might have 100 attendees for the Great Reunion weekend. At last count, we have doubled that number with over 200 people making plans to attend the Pioneer District Spring Convention.



The Pioneer District board has had many conversations on how to keep everyone safe from the spread of Covid-19 during this event. The Board has adopted a policy similar to BHS that all participants have either been vaccinated or had a negative test within 72 hours from the start of the event that will need to be shown to get your registration badge. There will be a link on the District website to upload a copy of your vaccination card to speed up the registration process. Finally to answer the question whether to mask or not to mask, there is not currently a mask mandate in Grand Rapids but the Board encourages you to wear a mask during this weekend event.

I'm looking forward to hearing all 16 quartets sing live on stage for the first time in over two years on Saturday. We have 14 quartets from the Pioneer District singing at this competition with an additional four quartets singing from out of District.

I can't wait to hear what non-competing quartets, VLQs, and choruses are going to be singing on Friday nights Singfest. I think it's a great opportunity for everyone to demonstrate that although we've been apart for several years, music truly does bring this together. Between the Tag Contest on Saturday on all of the Classes / Workshops that are being offered (including a coaching under glass) I'm not sure that I'm going to be sleeping much that weekend.

But I think the most exciting thing about the last weekend in April is that I'm going to be able to see all of you once again!

When you talk to Cole Carey, it seems like he's got it all figured out.

Started barbershopping at seven, joined the society at eight. Sang on an international stage four times—three with The Voice youth chorus and once with Grand Rapids. Put together a youth quartet that took fifth place in the international junior varsity youth quartet championship in 2020. Started and directed a youth chorus in his hometown of Cadillac to attract other young singers to his favorite hobby in 2021.

And in just under a week, his new quartet, Shoreline, will compete in the Pioneer District's first youth quartet championship against nothing but their own expectations.

The quartet, made up of Cole, fellow Cadillac High Schooler Caleb Downey, Ludington High School student Maddie Cooper and Kayla Reed of West Shore Community College, have all been musicians for their entire lives. Just a week before their debut at the Pioneer District, I had the chance to sit down with Cole, Caleb and Kayla to get to know more about the quartet before they cross the district stage.
